PROFESSIONAL DIMENSIONS ANNOUNCES 2021-2023 SIGNATURE PROJECT

PD's Charitable Fund pledges \$100,000 to nonprofit benefiting homeless women and their children

MILWAUKEE, October 27, 2021 — Milwaukee-based Professional Dimensions, a network of more than 400 local women leaders, announced Nia Imani as its signature Charitable Fund recipient, pledging to raise \$100,000 over two years. Funds will be collected from a mix of donations from individual members, corporate sponsors and via the proceeds from the PD Imprint Awards.

To date, the Professional Dimensions Charitable Fund (PDCF) has donated more than \$1.6 million to local projects and initiatives that advance the self-sufficiency of women and girls.

“Not only does Nia Imani’s mission align with PDCF’s, but they are a small, locally-based organization that will benefit significantly from our support,” said Lauren Feaster, Professional Dimensions CEO. “We are honored to contribute to Nia Imani’s important mission, which aligns with our mission to support women and girls and to help them become self-sufficient.”

Nia Imani, a 501c3 nonprofit serving the Milwaukee area, supports independent living for mothers and their children recovering from homelessness, violence and traumatic life experiences. The agency provides homeless young, pregnant or first-time mothers with safe, orderly housing in a family-like setting. Families stay up to two years, during which they can come to terms with and manage childhood trauma and learn critical life skills including accountability, self-examination, goal setting and parenting so they can become self-sufficient parents who foster healthy relationships. Funding from the Professional Dimensions Charitable Fund will support Nia Imani’s Muhindi parenting program.

Professional Dimensions’ women will engage with Nia Imani through mentoring, small groups, life skills workshops, donation drives and financial support.

“Nia Imani was born out of a desire to shine a spotlight on a population of marginalized women and children that are often invisible,” said Dr. Belinda Pittman, CEO of Nia Imani. “We are extremely grateful that Professional Dimensions and its members have chosen to support Nia Imani, and we look forward to their help in further elevating this important issue.”
